

7 Things to Make Your Resume Rememberable

- Add keywords in your previous job description(s) that match the words in the job posting.
- 2. Make a 'relevant experience' section of your resume. Select 1-2 of your previous jobs that match the job you are applying to.
- 3. Remove the objective statement. It ends up taking up space and doesn't add much to a resume.
- 4. Answer these 3 questions in your resume bullet points. Make it short but concise.
 - a. What did you do?
 - b. Why did you do it?
 - c. What was the result?
- 5. Include volunteer work. This shows you are involved in your community. It helps to add this if you don't have a ton of work experience.
- 6. Tailor your resume to each job you are applying for. Don't just send in the same one every time.
- 7. Make sure all spelling and grammar are correct. Ensure the format flows and there are no random spaces.
